## Very Important Information on the Condition of the Presbytery External Walls.

Dear Parishioners, 18 months ago, I gave a full presentation of the conditions of the buildings associated with St. Stephens Parish Blairgowrie. While substantial works have been done in St. and Stephen's church, St. Luan's church surroundings, St. Mary's Cottage Coupar Angus and the abandoned two Flats (that now give us income) on No.10 Bank Street since my arrival here, the external walls of the presbytery both from Bank Street and John's Street are in very deplorable conditions. Please take time to walk around it. A closer observation of the external walls of the presbytery presents the following conditions:

**From Bank Street**: Sand stones works especially below the window level and at some other points nearer the roof are showing some serious weaknesses and need repointing; Stones works around windows have receded to more than 7 inches exposing window seals and frames; All the Sliding wooden windows are stiff and so do not open which are serious health and safety issues in the case of fire outbreak; All the windows there are single glaze and some are cracked.

**From behind the presbytery**: Sand stone works and window hoods are in deplorable conditions needing repointing; Previous efforts to use cements on sand stones has further made it worse as these surfaces have pulled off with years of frost getting in-between cement and sand stones; There are holes on the wall behind my kitchen as deep as 10 inches; Sandstones supporting the gutters are worn out leaving the gutters weak.

Aware that times are hard, we have been saving for this project which we intend to start this July. With the estimates coming in, there is a likelihood that we would be needing some help to complete. If you feel able to support the work on the parish presbytery external walls, it would be very much appreciated. You can reach out to Mike Coyle, Jim Graham or Fr. Gregory. Thanks.

**Reflection**: Exodus 19:2-6a, the first reading for the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, is a beautiful passage that describes the arrival of the Israelites at Mount Sinai and God's message to Moses. God reminds the Israelites of how He delivered them from slavery in Egypt and declared that if they obey His commands and keep His covenant, they will be a treasured possession and a kingdom of priests. As Catholics, we too are called to be a people set apart for God, called to follow His commandments and live a life of holiness.

God's message to the Israelites in this passage reminds us of the importance of living a life of obedience to God's commands. Our obedience to God's will is not just about following rules, but it is an expression of our love and gratitude for all that He has done for us. When we live a life of obedience to God, we become a people set apart for Him, a holy nation that reflects His glory to the world.

As we reflect on this passage, we are called to examine our own lives and ask ourselves whether we are living a life of obedience to God's will. Are we following His commandments with joy and gratitude, or are we struggling to live up to His standards? As we strive to live a life of obedience, we can take comfort in the fact that God is with us every step of the way. He has promised to be our God and to walk with us on this journey of faith, guiding us and strengthening us along the way. From Young Catholics
