Going Back to Galilee Without Fear

The Gospel of the resurrection of Jesus Christ begins with the journey of the women to the tomb at dawn on the day after the sabbath. They go to the tomb to honour the body of the Lord, but they found it open and empty. A mighty angel said to them: "Do not be afraid(28.5) and orders them to go and tell the disciples: "He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee". The women quickly depart and on the way Jesus himself meets them and says: "Do not fear, go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me". (v10) "Do not be afraid, do not fear" These are words that encourage us to open our hearts to receive the message.

After the death of the master, the disciples had scattered; their faith had been utterly shaken, everything seemed over, all their certainties had crumbled, and their hopes had died. But now, that message of the women, incredible as it was, came to them as a ray of light in the darkness. The news spread: Jesus is risen as he said. And then, there was his command to go to Galilee; the women had heard it twice, first from the angel and then from Jesus himself: Let them go to Galilee; there they will see me''. 'Do not fear'' and ''go to Galilee is the place were there were first called, where everything began. For each of us there is a Galilee, an existential Galilee, the experience of a personal encounter with Christ. Where is my Galilee?
