<u>This week</u>: The story of the Rich Man and Lazarus, or in Hebrew *Eliezer*, which means *God will help* could focus on

- the ultimate settling of accounts,
- the final judgment that will level off all injustices.
- It could urge the need to care for the poor on our own doorsteps, who call out for a better life.
- The rich man did not deny the existence of Lazarus, he just ignored it, or accepted drastic inequality as normality. There can be an ostrich mentality that often ignores the needs of those that are not well off.
- The promise of life after death should not be used as an anaesthetic to dull the need to work for justice in the real world.

Opening Prayer: O God of justice, hear our cry and save us. Make us heed your word to the prophets; rouse us to the demand of the gospel and impel us to carry it out. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

Introduction to the Scripture Readings Amos 6: 1, 4-7 Amos warns the wealthy about their selfishness. 1 Timothy 6: 11-16 Paul gives Timothy tips on being a disciple of the Lord Jesus. Luke 16: 19-31 A reminder that wealth can insulate us from seeing the needs of others.

Journeying together in Faith Group. Next Session: 3rd Oct. 6pm. Topics discussed so far: Prayer: How, when and where to pray, types of prayer; Purgatory: meaning, why and how long before they are freed, Should we pray for or to those in purgatory; Sin; venial and mortal sins; Reconciliation; Hell, a state of deprivation not a place, devil, fallen angels, will and choice; Mercy of God: works of charity, Kinds of Baptism: Baptism by desire, blood and water etc. Following the recommendations of the parish group "Conversation in the Spirit." we shall continue to test run this initiative in our parish within an atmosphere of a relaxed, friendly and welcoming gathering every fortnight.

Parish Diversity Day Celebration: Sunday 28th September 2025. This year will showcase cultural diversity in a unique setting: Flags A4bsize, multi linguistic mass celebration and prayers, songs, poems, cloths, prints, culinary and many other initiatives from our diver communities in the parish.

A Reflection: **Gospel:** In all the parables of Jesus only one person is given a name. That person is named in today's gospel. It is a person who had been totally neglected — Lazarus. A name which means "God is my help." The name reveals the compassion of God. The message is that God notices, cares, and acts out of love.

The Gospel reminds us that God has the last and definitive word over rich and poor. We have plenty of guidance on what God expects of us. We have the prophets like Amos, the scriptures, the social teaching of the church, the preaching and example of Christ (the one who came back from the dead) and the witness of the saints. This should focus our attention and inform our priorities.

Our faith compels us to be committed to working for justice, and against poverty. Poverty in broadest sense—the lonely, the sick, bereaved, those trapped in addiction or anxiety, those unable to forgive.

There is a link between Inattentional blindness and sin. The rich man in the parable is not accused of gaining his wealth by unjust means. His sin is the sin of omission: he failed to "see the

gorilla." Self-centeredness leads to indifference towards others, an incapacity to see and feel their suffering. The rich man's sin was not that he was rich, but that he was not aware enough to share. We all have our personal and communal blind spots; listening and reflection can help us be more aware of the suffering of others

Our gifts are not for hoarding or self-indulgence. The name of Abraham is mentioned, a reminder that we have a covenant responsibility to each other. God's covenant is with an entire people which is one family. (2 Sam 7:8-17). Pope Francis: "I ask all people of goodwill to help build a culture of encounter, solidarity and peace."

We are given vision and take our direction from God, and this helps us to act out of love. Love is sensitive, attentive, proactive, generous and relieves suffering. Love helps us to notice and to act. We all have something we can share — to use our time and resources with an eye to the eternal (Matt 25:31-46). We have the gift of speech to offer a kind word, and the gift of compassion, because someone somewhere is hurting.

Be aware of the Lazarus' in our own communities...they may need our help in this life, and we may need their help in the next.

News from the Vatican: Pope Leo urges Catholics to pray daily Rosary for Peace in October

Pope Leo XIV invites the faithful to join in praying the Rosary every day during October to invoke God's gift of peace, and announces a Rosary in St. Peter's Square on October 11 as part of the Jubilee of Marian Spirituality.

Catholics across the globe will unite to pray the Rosary for peace in war-torn lands, especially during the month of October, which the Church dedicates to the Holy Rosary.

Pope Leo XIV made the announcement at the Wednesday General Audience.

He said the faithful in Rome will gather in St. Peter's Square on October, 11, 2025 at 6:00 PM.

"I invite everyone, each day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace—personally, in the family, and in community," he said.

The Pope also invited Vatican employees to pray the Rosary daily in St. Peter's Basilica at 7:00 PM throughout October.

In his greetings to Portuguese pilgrims, Pope Leo lamented the "ruins wrought by murderous hatred."

He invited Christians to share with others "the love of Jesus that illumines and lifts up humanity."

The Rosary for Peace will be held during the Jubilee of Marian Spirituality, which takes place on October 11-12.
