This week as we reflect on All Saints and All Souls: Asleep in Jesus! Blessed sleep:

The last week of October and early November can hold memories, worries and doubts for many as to "what if" As we! look to the direction of the celebration and commemoration of All Saints and All Souls respectively this month of November, we pray with the whole church for our beloved dead; our loved ones gone before us marked with the sign of faith, the book of wisdom makes clear to us the reason for the Christian faith and the hope we have for our beloved dead. The commemoration of All Souls most importantly often dulls the joys of all saints.

For the book of Wisdom says, "their going looked like a disaster ...but they are in peace ...for grace and mercy await those God has chosen."

St. Paul, aware of the pains of loss and need for consolation while writing to the Romans notes: "nothing can come between us and the love of Christ. ..For we are certain of this: neither death nor life, no angel, no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, no height or depth nor any created thing can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Rom 8: 31-35. 37-39.

So that in the midst of our sadness at their departure, it is faith in Jesus, which gives us hope and consolation because <u>Jesus has</u> shown us that life means more than this earthly existence; that in <u>fact life will continue beyond death where it reaches its fullest expression in the vision of God's glory in heaven.</u>

It is our hope that through our prayers our beloved dead be free from all pains and sufferings, that they will be united with God where they will enjoy eternal life of peace, joy and thankfulness in the beatific vision of God's glory. Christ makes clear to us in the gospel that He is the way to this eternal life of peace, joy thankfulness, He is the truth and the life and no one can come to the Father except through Him. Where He has gone we will follow.

On this commemoration of All Souls let us pray and light a candle (this week) for the souls of the faithful departed who are being purified. Let our faith lead us to understand that, just as God has not stopped loving these poor souls because of their imperfections, neither have we. For this very reason, of course, we pray for our beloved dead, believing that our prayers assist them as they come to meet God face-to-face. We firmly believe that your prayers and the masses we celebrate for them will help them secure the forgiveness of their sins and the eternal rest of

their souls. We also hope that by living his commands, we will one day reach the heavenly homeland to be with God and our loved ones again forever. Jesus, our Lord, who rose from the dead extends to his faithful people, the hope of new and everlasting life and that happiness which will never end. Eternal rest grant unto them o Lord, ...

Opening Prayer: O God, who alone can probe the depths of the heart, you hear the prayer of the humble and justify the repentant sinner. As we stand before you, grant us the gift of humility, that we may see our own sins clearly and refrain from judging our neighbour. We make our prayer through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

Introduction to the Scripture Readings Ecclesiasticus 35: 12-14, 16-19 The Lord is not deferential to the powerful but takes the side of the powerless. 2 Timothy 4: 6-8, 16-18 Paul speaks of his imminent death and reflects on his own deep faith. Luke 18: 9-14 Humility before God is a recurring theme in the readings: the Gospel describes the Pharisee and the tax collector.

Between the humble heart and the arrogant self-righteous hearts: The story of the Tax Collector and the Pharisee.

Genuine humility is simply recognizing the essential truth about ourselves. It is honest self-appraisal, in God's presence, with no pretences, masks or poses. Iin the presence of the all-holy, all-powerful God each of us knows himself/herself as weak, imperfect and indeed sinful; and with this we recognise our need for mercy. There is no bribe that we can offer to blot out our guilt. There is no pressure we can exert (as we might among ourselves) to gain a credit we do not deserve. Our best recourse is a humble spirit; this attitude will draw down on us divine mercy and grace. The Publican felt this need for complete honesty, as he stood in the Temple of God. "Lord, be merciful," he said; and went home with his sins forgiven and with relief in his heart.
